NYACP continues to monitor state legislation that impacts internal medicine, primary care, and patients in New York State.



Wrongful Death Bill Vetoed Again

Members responded to various call to action requests, which resulted with Governor Hochul vetoing the Wrongful Death/Grieving Families bill for the third consecutive year.



Another Step Therapy Bill Chaptered

The new step therapy law prohibits patients from having to step through an off-label medication or trying and failing on more than one drug.
